My name is Kevin Taylor and I am running for Vice President of SACP.

I am Associate Professor of Teaching in the Department of Philosophy at the University of Memphis. As a member of the Department of Philosophy, I serve as Online Coordinator responsible for the department online program. I have also served as Director of Religious Studies since 2021. I specialize in Japanese Buddhism (especially Hakuin Zen), Classical American Pragmatism (especially Dewey), and Data Ethics (focusing on Confucian and Buddhist approaches to data technology).
